## **1.0 CALL TO ORDER**

## **5.0 ITEMS OF BUSINESS**

### **5.1 City Manager's Recommended Fiscal Year 2023-2024 Annual Operating and Capital Budget**

Mr. Jeffrey Yates, Assistant City Manager, reviewed the budget Group # 2 questions submitted by the Mayor and Council members and provided the responses from staff.

Mr. Yates then presented items from the City Manager's recommended FY 2023-2024 annual operating and capital budget. He provided a review of the 2022 General Obligation Bond Funding Plan and the impact of possible vehicle tax on the bond tax rate. He also provided a review of ARPA Programs and Funding, the Capital Improvement Plan funding discussion, Review of Projected Fund Balance, Strategic Process for the three years, and Review of Parking Lot Items.

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City Council members present took a consensus vote on the Parking Lot items to include them in the recommended annual budget for FY 2023-2024:

Consensus to appropriate an additional \$250,000.00 to the Cape Fear Regional Theatre proposed expansion.

Consensus to appropriate \$350,000.00 to the Glennville Lake Walking Trail.

Consensus to appropriate \$75,000.00 to the Phoenix Rape Crisis Center for a Contract for Service.

Consensus to appropriate \$250,000.00 for the initiation of an Office of Community Safety. Mr. Douglas Hewett, City Manager, asked the Council members to provide feedback on this item; what this means, and where do you want it to go.

Council Member Banks-McLaughlin requested funding for a Homeless Shelter and an Emergency Day Resource Center, both requests received no support from Council.

Consensus to increase the vehicle tax by \$20.00, to a total of \$30.00.

Mr. Douglas Hewett, City Manager, stated the next budget meeting is scheduled for June 21, 2023, at 12 noon.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 2:24 p.m.
