
HUD Plans and Budgets

2020-2024 Consolidated Plan (five-year)

- Adopted by Council to include all anticipated income and expenses
- New Emergency Solutions Grants Program (ESG) requires amendment to five-year plan

2024 Annual Action Plan (one-year)

- City awarded \$155,374 in ESG funds- notified on May 7, 2024
- Changed Homebuyer HEROS funding source to remove match





What is ESG?

 The Emergency Solutions Grants (ESG) program helps individuals and families regain stability in permanent housing after a housing

crisis or homelessness.

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

Eligible Activities	Description
Street Outreach	Engagement, case management
Emergency Shelter	Shelter operations, rennovation, or conversion
Homelessness Prevention	Security deposits, utility deposits/payments,
And Rapid Re-Housing	rental assistance, housing stability
Homeless Management	Software to collect and track information about
Information System	resources and needs for unhoused population

- Outreach and Shelter (40% MAX)
- Administration limited to 7.5% (\$11,653)
- Note: Homeless Management Information System (HMIS) is already funded through City/County Interlocal Agreement

Next Steps

- Hold public hearing on August 12, 2024
- ECD submit HUD plan
- ECD will post a Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA)
- Nonprofits (501c3) can apply for Federal funds under ESG
- Nonprofits must match funds \$1:\$1
- Scoring Criteria:
 - Funding priorities in accordance with survey results (Homeless prevention and Rapid rehousing top priority)
 - Nonprofits must establish presence Fayetteville CARES (DRC)
 - Experience with unhoused populations
 - Alignment with City and CoC goals
