



Safe and Secure Community FMHA and Crime Deterrence

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- Gather data on whether crime is occurring at properties owned or operated by the Fayetteville Metropolitan Housing Authority (FMHA); and
- Use said data to engage with the FMHA on potential crime deterrent partnership opportunities if necessary.



- There are 138 properties total under the FMHA.
- The Neighborhood Improvement Team (NIT) was created through a contract between the FMHA and the Fayetteville Police Department (FPD).
- The NIT's salaries paid by the FMHA, and they receive benefits through the FMHA.
- The assigned police officers visit the multifamily complexes daily and the scattered sites at least monthly.



- Specifically designated to assist the FMHA
- Patrol all FMHA properties
- Conduct background checks on new tenants
- Assist in maintaining the trespass list
- Conduct apartment checks with housing managers
- Attend all FMHA hearings for tenants
- Traffic enforcement for the FMHA
- Investigate both misdemeanor and felony incidents that take place on the FMHA properties
