

Consistency and Reasonableness Statement

Map Amendments

Pursuant N.C.G.S. Sections 160D-604 and -605, the Planning Commission finds that the proposed text amendment for Chapter 30, Article 30-3, Section 30-3.H.3; Section 30-3.H.3.a is consistent/inconsistent with the City of Fayetteville's Future Land Use Map and Plan (Comprehensive Plan). 
