

SPECIAL REVENUE FUND PROJECT ORDINANCE
 AMENDMENT 2026-5

WHEREAS, North Carolina is part of a historic opioid settlement that is estimated to be over \$50 billion; and
 WHEREAS, funds must be used to either support treatment, recovery, harm reduction, or other life-saving programs and
 WHEREAS, the City of Fayetteville is projected to receive \$3,740,222 between now and 2038; and
 WHEREAS, Council voted in August 2023 to authorize a resolution to fund the Law Enforcement Assisted Diversion
 WHEREAS, the City will continue to fund the LEAD program for one year; and
 NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Fayetteville, North Carolina, that pursuant to section 13.2 of Chapter 159 of the General Statutes of North Carolina, the following special revenue project ordinance is hereby amended:

Section 1. The project change authorized is to Special Revenue Fund Project Ordinance 2026-5, adopted June 23, 2025, for the funding of the continuation of the Fayetteville Police Department Law Enforcement Assisted Diversion Program.

Section 2. The project director is hereby directed to proceed with the project within the terms of the various agreements executed and within the funds appropriated herein.

Section 3. The following revenues are anticipated to be available to the City to complete the project:
