

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FAYETTEVILLE AMENDING ARTICLE VII, WRECKER AND TOW SERVICE, OF CHAPTER 24, STREETS AND SIDEWALKS, OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF FAYETTEVILLE, NORTH CAROLINA

BE IT ORDAINED, by the City Council of the City of Fayetteville, North Carolina, that:

Section 1. Section 24-223, Duties and Requirements of Licensees under This Article, of Chapter 24, Streets and Sidewalks, is amended by adding the following at the end of the section:

- (o) Licensees shall clean up and remove from the street, highway or right-of-way, any broken glass, vehicular parts, contents of a disabled vehicle, or other debris before leaving the scene of the accident, to the satisfaction of the police officer or firefighter at the scene.

Section 2. Article VII, Wrecker and Tow Service, of Chapter 24, Streets and Sidewalks, is amended by adding the following section:

Sec. 24-249. Duties and Requirements of Towing Operators/Non-Licensees.

All towing operators engaged to perform a tow as defined in Section 24-221, shall clean up and remove from the street, highway or right-of-way, any broken glass, vehicular parts, contents of a disabled vehicle, or other debris before leaving the scene of the accident, to the satisfaction of the police officer or firefighter at the scene. In addition to any other remedy available in this Fayetteville City Code, a violation of this section is also punishable as a misdemeanor with a fine greater than \$50.00 but not more than \$500.00, pursuant to N.C.G.S. 14-4. Each day's continuing violation shall constitute a separate offense.

Section 3. It is the intention of the City Council, and it is hereby ordained that the provisions of this ordinance shall become and be made part of the Code or Ordinances, City of Fayetteville, North Carolina, and the sections of this ordinance may be renumbered to accomplish such intention.
