Updated applicability and procedures:

- References to the enabling legislation under 160D
- Appeals process updated to conform with Unified Development Ordinance (Zoning Commission reviews initial appeals of HRC decisions)
- New design review criteria qualifying minor and major work as well as non-reviewable work.
- New appendices including
 - Historic Districts and Local Landmark listing
 - Fire District Design Standards and Overlay
 - Design Guidelines for Murals
- New Introductory statement addressing intent
- New sub-section addressing applicability of the Design Standards
- New diagrams for clarifying and identifying visual context (views from public street)

Guidelines vs. Standards: Reorganization of Design Review

DGs provide overall direction for recommended action, the DSs *specifically* regulate three <u>possible actions</u> on the part of the applicant: **Preserve, Repair, Replace**

Example: Certificate of Appropriateness (COA) request:

New awning for building located in the Downtown Historic District with an existing awning Design Guidelines:

Options and Recommendation

- Remand draft ordinance back to staff for further consideration
