 - Challenges with meeting quorum
 - Many newly appointed members did not show up
 - Term expiration of existing members - Life happens scheduling conflicts
- Conversations with the Chief of Police
 - Who is responsible for community safety? (prior to current director's hiring)
 - As crime trends up, something has to change with policing, right?
 - Hot spots change, Types of criminal activities shift
 - Police Chief Responses
 - Trends are tracked, efforts are shifted based on these trends
 - Technology – FUSES, LPRS updates, following the data on crime statistics
- Board Members & Citizen Engagement
 - Meet & greet at fitness centers, attended community watch & City Council meetings
 - Observed officer engagement with community
 - Community events i.e. Dogwood festival
 - Community disaster – EES students
