

FY 21-22 Annual Action Plan – Amendment Public Hearing

May 23, 2022



- The American Rescue Plan appropriated additional funds to help communities provide housing, shelter, and services to people experiencing homelessness and housing instability.
- The City of Fayetteville received \$3,397,564 as a part of FY2021 American Rescue Plan Program grant.
- This one-time funding is in addition to the city's regular HOME formula allocation.



- Homeless,
- At-risk of homelessness,
- Fleeing, or attempting to flee, domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, stalking, or human trafficking,
- In other populations where providing supportive services would serve those with the greatest risk of housing instability; and
- Veterans and families that include a veteran family member that meet one of the preceding criteria.

- Production or preservation of Affordable Housing
- Purchase and Development of Non-Congregate Shelter
- Tenant-based Rental Assistance (TBRA)
- Supportive Services
