## **A RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF IMMIGRANT COMMUNITIES IN FAYETTEVILLE**

WHEREAS, the City of Fayetteville recognizes the vital role that immigrants of all countries have played and continue to play in the growth, diversity, and prosperity of our community; and

WHEREAS, our town upholds the values of inclusivity, equity, and justice as cornerstones of our democracy; and

WHEREAS, the City of Fayetteville is a welcoming community and prides itself on being a Place for Everyone; and

WHEREAS, the collaboration between immigrant communities and local law enforcement is essential for the safety and well-being of all residents; and

WHEREAS, equitable access to municipal services, education, and opportunities for civic engagement for all residents, regardless of immigration status, is essential to the fabric of our town.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Fayetteville that the Council:

- Commits to fostering a welcoming environment for all immigrants living in, working in, and contributing to our City.
- Supports local initiatives to provide all residents with access to municipal services, including various forms of education, and law enforcement protection, regardless of immigration status.
- Empowers and encourages law enforcement officials to intentionally foster trust and cooperation with our diverse immigrant communities.
- Encourages the community to engage in dialogue and cultural exchange to bolster mutual understanding and respect among all residents of Fayetteville.
