



 - Spoke to 50 people about the Plan
- Two Open Houses -
 - First session held 8/3/17, 24 attendees College Lakes Rec Center
 - Second session to be held 2/15/18 Westover Rec Center
- Website, Survey, Interactive Mapping
 - 1000+ responses, comments and suggestions incorporated in the recommendations

Challenges


- High traffic volumes
- Heavy retail presence

- Many pedestrian accidents


Few to no pedestrian amenities on many corridors.

"All legs of signalized intersections must have marked crosswalks, unless prohibited."

"Pedestrians are unlikely to comply with a 3-stage crossing"






Understanding the Recommendations

Recommendations for the City were developed by identifying:


- Pedestrian safety/activity
- Schools
- Parks
- Shopping
- Business centers
- Households living at/under poverty
- Connection to transit



Computer model was then developed to highlight focus areas.



Draft Intersection & Sidewalk Recommendations




- ✓ 283 miles of sidewalk exist.
- 106 recommended sidewalk projects.
- Plan recommends 36
 additional miles of sidewalk
 facilities providing connectivity
 near schools, commercial
 areas and high need areas.
- 62 intersection improvements.

Proposed Sidewalk Projects Total \$15,000,000*

Proposed Intersection Projects

* The final Plan will include a 20 year build prioritization plan.



Timeline

- Public Meeting 2/15/2018
 - Westover Rec Center
 - Gather feedback on the facility recommendations
- Review the recommendations and comments received from the public, develop the final recommendations and 20- year build prioritization list.
- April 2018 Present Final Draft Plan to Council
