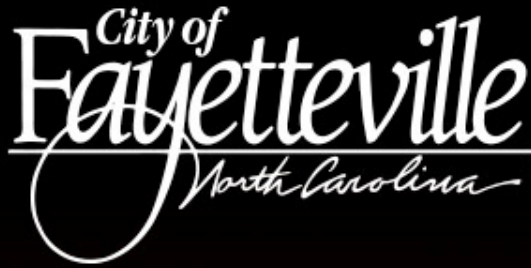

Background

- Proposed in FY 2019 Budget
- Fares last increased April 2013
- Improved Services
 - New Transit Center
 - Sunday Service
 - Reduced Ride & Wait Times (Routes 14, 16, 17)
- All Fare Categories
- Transition to Cashless - ADA Paratransit

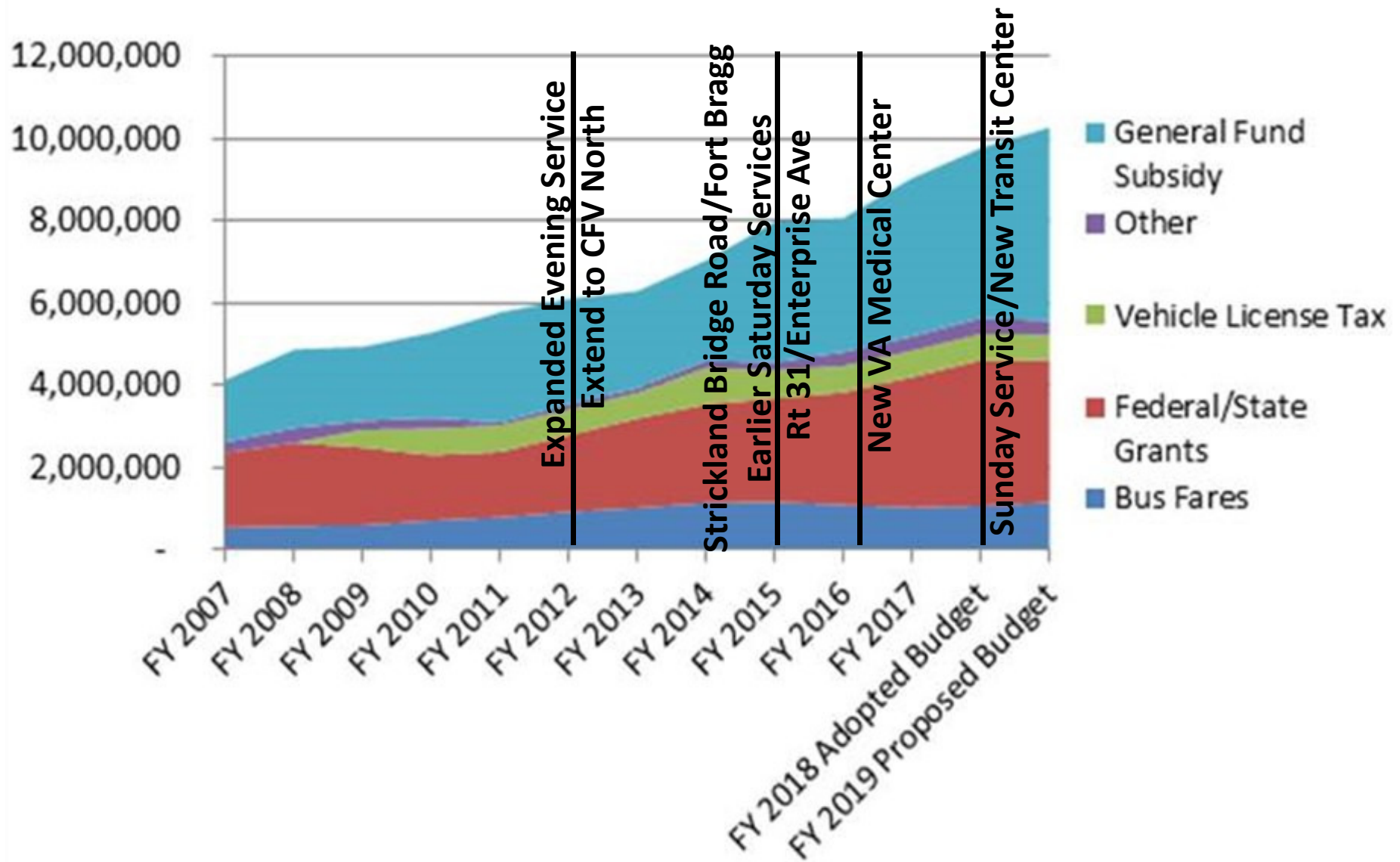


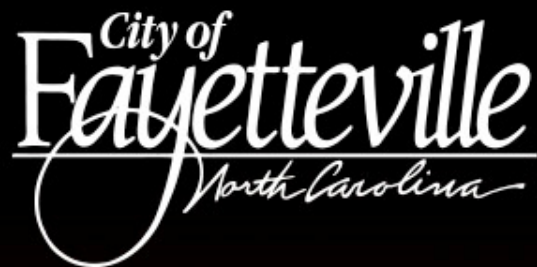
Comparison with Peer Cities

- Current Fares – Lower/Mid-Range
- Some Categories – Lower
 - Senior & Disabled Discount
 - ADA Paratransit
- Fare Recovery – Slightly Lower
- Other Factors
 - Local Funding to Service Population- Slightly Lower
 - Fare % of State & Local Funding-Lower

FY 2007 - FY2017 Actual, FY 2018 - FY2019 Budget

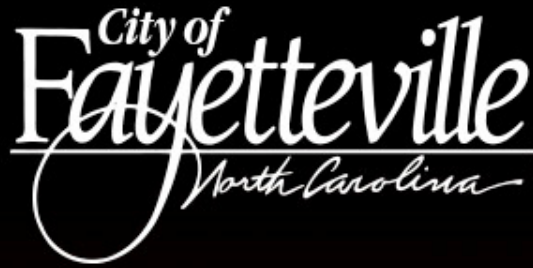




Proposed Fares

- Adult Full Fare (1-Ride) \$1.25 to \$1.50
- Seniors & Disabled (1-Ride) \$0.50 to \$0.65
- Day Pass – Adult (24 Hrs) \$3.00 to \$4.00
- Day Pass – Senior/Disabled \$1.50 to \$2.00
- Day Pass – Youth (<18 Yrs) \$2.00 to \$2.50
- ADA One Ride \$2.00 to \$2.50
 - ADA 6-Ride Pass New \$15
- ADA 20-Ride Pass \$35 to \$44
- 30-Day Pass – Adult \$40 to \$48
- 30-Day Pass – Senior/Disabled \$17 to \$24

Note: Fixed Route passes allow unlimited rides including round trips for a specified period beginning with first use
