May 31, 2005

City and PWC executed a Fleet Services Agreement

<u>May 2017</u>

- PWC Commissioners voted to provide notice of their intent to terminate agreement with City effective June 30, 2018
- Commissioner Shaw sent letter to former Mayor Robertson dated May 10, 2017 to provide notice of PWC's intent to terminate agreement effective June 30, 2018
- *According to the revised Charter, shared services are only to be provided if cost is at or below the prevailing market rate

July 2017

Fleet Maintenance Committee established (CMs Arp, Crisp and Mohn and PWC Commissioners
Fowler and Rogers)



September 2017

- Five responses received to Request for Information (RFI): Serco Inc., Reston, VA; Harrell's Auto Service,
 Fayetteville; Vector Fleet Management, Charlotte; First Vehicle Services, Cincinnati, Ohio; Penske Truck Leasing, Charlotte
- Submittals provided sufficient data and information to begin to author a Request for Proposals (RFP)

October 2017

- Information sessions with five potential vendors provided staff with recommendations for a Request for Proposal (RFP) format
- Information sessions identified several critical areas to be included in the RFP: Facility, Fleet Life Cycle, Targeted and Non-Targeted Costing Methodologies, and Current Fleet Data/Information

December 2017

Multiple Meetings held to discuss scope of work and RFP format



January 2018

 RFP advertised January 16 on both the City's website and the Interactive Purchasing Site of the State of North Carolina (IPS)

February 2018

- Pre-Proposal conference was held at City Hall on February 7 with the following companies in attendance:
 Harrell's Auto Service, Atlantic Emergency Services, First Vehicle Services, Amerit Fleet Solutions, Serco,
 Vector Fleet Management
- The City issued an addendum on February 26 extending the proposal submission deadline to March 15, 2018 and provided answers and clarification to the vendor questions received.

March 2018

The City received eight proposals on March 15 from the following firms: Atlantic Emergency Services,
 Amerit Fleet Solutions, First Vehicle Services, Harrell's Auto Service, H&H Auto Service, Penske, Serco, and Vector Fleet Management



April 2018 Fleet Evaluation Team Meetings:

- April 4- Discussed current issues with fleet maintenance/management
- April 12- Discussed departmental desires for fleet maintenance & management moving forward
- April 20- Briefed by Budget on the current cost accounting process for fleet maintenance & management
- April 23- Met with Strategic Performance Analytics dept. who performed a SWOT Analysis focusing on three
 options:
 - 1) Maintaining current fleet maintenance and management system
 - 2) Hybrid approach with a combination private sector/PWC Fleet Maintenance solution
 - 3) Outsourcing entire fleet maintenance operation

April 30 Fleet Maintenance Committee Meeting

- Staff provided feedback from evaluation of eight proposals received
- Evaluation Matrix provided to Committee
- Direction received to proceed to next steps with the top three proposals
 - First Vehicle Services
 - Serco
 - Vector Fleet Management



Unplanned or Non-Targeted Maintenance

Unplanned Maintenance is also known as reactive maintenance, corrective maintenance, breakdown maintenance, or run-to-failure maintenance. The trigger for this type of maintenance is normally a breakdown.

Unplanned Maintenance activities 3x more costly than planned maintenance. A high percentage of unplanned maintenance can dramatically drain financial resources.





Review and Recommendations

- Presentations by First Vehicle Services, Serco and Vector Fleet Management to the Fleet Evaluation Team
 - Written responses to questions from the Fleet Evaluation Team
 - In-depth presentations on proposals and overview of business model and practices

Team Recommendation: Consider further review and vetting of the following companies:

- 1) Vector Fleet Management- A North Carolina Company, targeted fixed cost pricing based on fleet lifecycles, <u>facility costs included</u> in target pricing, availability guarantees: 133 Pepsi Lane Facility
- **2) First Vehicle Services** Facility identified but not included in pricing and targeted fixed cost pricing based on demands
- Both vendors proposed a comprehensive approach to the management and maintenance services of the complete fleet.
- Proposals included a centrally located facility, extensive transition plan, a costing methodology that includes target and/or non-targeted pricing correlated to a fleet life cycle, or cost plus parts and materials
- Both have experience in maintaining and managing similar fleet quantity and composition.
