

On July 2, 2021, McCormick was found guilty of two counts of human trafficking, four counts of promoting prostitution, and one count of PWISD cocaine. In 2021 the number of offenders released from jail to electronic monitoring for Murder has increased 66.7% compared to 2020.

In 2021 the number of offenders released from jail to electronic monitoring for Agg Assault has increased by 200% compared to 2020

Violent offenses such as Murder & Aggravated Assault have shown increase while likelihood of incarceration awaiting trial has decreased
