Executive Summary:

NCGS § 160A-299 gives authority and procedures for the City to close a city street or alley. Several Wells Subdivision property owners have petitioned to close a portion of Merrimac Drive. This portion of Merrimac Drive has never been opened and is considered a paper street. Closing the street will not deny access to any property owners. The first step in the process dictated by NCGS § 160A-299 is to have a resolution signed granting the public hearing to consider the closing. Staff would like to set the public hearing for March 26, 2018 which would allow the statutory procedures to be followed. A resolution and map of the proposed closing is attached for reference.
