Background:
Mayor Pro Tem Mohn presented this item to City Council at the May 7, 2018 work session. Unanimous consensus of Council was to direct staff to move this item forward to the May 14, 2018 regular meeting agenda.

Ms. Jenn Alexander, Resident of District 8 and Member of the National Organization of women and a volunteer with the League of Women's Voters' Health Care Legislative Action Team, has requested to present to City Council information on HB 662 (Carolina Cares). Ms. Alexander has also requested

Council consideration of a Resolution in support of the bill.

Carolina Cares would bridge the gap in healthcare coverage for those who do not qualify for Medicaid but also don't qualify for ACA subsidies. This includes 38,000 people in Cumberland County alone, and 12,000 veterans in our state.
