Adoption of Capital Project Ordinance 2019-19 to Appropriate Grant Funding for a Portable Shelter System Hub

Relationship To Strategic Plan:

Goal 1: The City of Fayetteville will be a safe and secure community.

Executive Summary:

Capital Project Ordinance 2019-19 will appropriate a \$27,900 grant from the U.S. Department of Homeland Security, passed through the North Carolina Department of Public Safety, Division of Emergency Management, for the purchase of a portable shelter system hub to provide interconnectivity with existing portable shelters. There is no local match required for the grant.

Background:

The City has received notification of the award of federal grant funds for the purchase of a portable shelter system hub. The DLX HUB Interconnectivity Shelter System equipment grant funds the purchase of a 17' x 17' quick deployment shelter that connects with two existing DLX tents owned by the Fayetteville Fire/Emergency Management Department to form a larger system. This shelter system is also part of a standardized and interoperable disaster deployable resource package developed by North Carolina Emergency Management.
